This award-winning documentary links everyday black men from various socioeconomic backgrounds with some of Black America's most progressive academics, social critics and authors to provide an engaging, candid dialogue on black masculine identity in American culture. Men And Domestic Violence: Broken Wings, Altschul Group Corporation: 1994. In this program, several men are shown dealing with their lifelong patterns of violent behavior. As the men attend group counseling, viewers learn that power and control are at the root of domestic violence, and that abuse comes in various forms. (19 minutes)
